Representative Matters

- Successfully secured partial summary judgment in a Southern District of New York insurance coverage action arising from a premises liability lawsuit involving a Verizon technician injured during WiFi installation. The court held that the co-insurer owed the building owner a duty to defend, but no duty to indemnify, finding that the injury occurred in a non-leased basement area to which the tenant lacked free access and which was not necessary for the tenant's use or enjoyment of the demised premises.
